KEY FUNCTION OF POSITION:

Plan and supervise silviculture and harvest activities as directed to ensure forest management goals and objectives are achieved in a manner consistent with relevant fiduciary, regulatory, and environmental guidelines.

SUMMARY OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Oversee engineering operations regarding layout, property line and corner locations, and road design on a unit-by-unit basis.
- Participate in administration of logging unit bids, road construction projects, road maintenance, and logging contracts and revisions.
- Participate in administration of surveying, road construction, leases, easements, and other real property management activities.
- Perform contract supervision (i.e., contractor compliance) of timber sales, contract logging, road construction, maintenance, silviculture, surveying, etc.
- Ensure appropriate permits and easements have been obtained before work begins.
- Ensure full and appropriate compliance with Forest Practice laws.
- Provide information to GIS Forester needed to update maps for assigned harvesting, road, and silvicultural activities.
- Assist in property level tours when needed.
- Actively participate in the implementation and utilization of GIS.
- Monitor expenditures and operation levels closely in order to comply with budget limitations.
- Participate in the annual budgeting process and “Forward Look” process, as needed.
- Maintain good communication and excellent working relationships with outside agencies and companies (Washington State Department of Natural Resources, Department of Fish & Wildlife, County Departments, and Tribal stakeholders, etc.)
- Stay abreast of industry technology, trends, new regulations and laws; attend meetings, as necessary.
- Become expert in client ownership patterns and manage accordingly.
- Support and participate fully in local SFI program.
- Ensure that environmental or financial risk management reporting is conducted in a timely and professional manner to the Area Manager and, if appropriate, local Safety Coordinator.

- Respond to internal and external information requests in conjunction with management and team members.
- Actively participate within the organization to ensure all timberland management investment services meet or exceed client commitments.
- Represent Campbell Global at all levels, maintaining positive public relations.
- Other duties/projects as assigned.
- Position is considered exempt based on job responsibilities.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR POSITION:

 - Working knowledge of the logging industry, sorting techniques, log values, etc.
 - Experience with planning, budgeting, and forecasting.
 - Understanding of state and federal regulations with respect to land use (i.e., share costs, easements, permits, etc.).
 - Demonstrated interpersonal skills.
 - Good communication skills, both oral and written.
 - Good computer skills.
- Ability to work in the outdoors over extremely rough, uneven terrain in all weather conditions required.
- Ability to lift up to 50 pounds
